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THE VIHIGA COUNTY FINANCE BILL, 2026

A Bill of the Vihiga County Assembly to provide for the imposition or variation of various fees, charges, licenses, rents and rates for services and for connected purposes

Enacted by the Vihiga County Assembly as follows—

PART I—PRELIMINARY

1. Short title and commencement

This bill, may be cited as the Vihiga County Finance bill, 2026 and shall come in to operation on the fourteenth day following publication in the *Kenya Gazette*.

2. Interpretation

In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires—

“advertisement” means any notice or representation employed wholly or partly for the purpose of drawing the attention of the public to or promoting any product or service;

“authorized channel” means the manner in which a person may effect payment to the County Government, including but not limited to a person designated by the county executive committee member pursuant to Section 157 of the Public Finance Management ACT, 2012 to collect or receive revenue or any other mode of payment as may be prescribed from time to time;

“branding” means company name/product, term, design, symbol or other feature that identifies a seller’s goods or services as distinct from those of other sellers for the purpose of drawing attention of the public or promoting any product or service.

“business” means—

- (a) trade, commerce or manufacture, profession, vocation or occupation;
- (b) any other activity in the nature of trade, commerce or manufacture, profession, vocation or occupation;
- (c) any activity carried out by a person continuously or regularly, whether or not for gain or profit and which involves, in part or in whole, the supply of goods or services for consideration;

“cess” means a levy charged on tradable agricultural and natural resources within the county;

“County” means Vihiga County;

“County Government” means the County Government of Vihiga;

“County Public Officer” means a county public officer within the meaning of Section 2 of the County Governments, 2012;

“County of Revenue Collector” has the same meaning assigned to the word

“collector of revenue” in paragraph (b) of Section 2 of the Public Finance Management ACT means the County Public Officer appointed pursuant to Section 158 of the Public Finance Management ACT, 2012; **“Executive Committee Member”** means the County

Executive Committee Member for the time being responsible for matters relating to finance in the County;

“**flammable**” means product capable of causing or being easily set on fire and of burning rapidly;

“**hearse**” means a vehicle tailor made for transporting/conveying a deceased person;

“**motorcycle sticker**” means a label, notice issued by the County Government of Vihiga to commercial motor bike operators within the Geographical location of Vihiga;

“**municipality**” means the geographical area defined by the Vihiga Municipality, Luanda Municipality and Kaimosi Municipality as per the respective gazette notices.

“**person**” means a natural or juristic person;

“**premise**” means any structure, whether of a permanent or temporary nature, in which trade is carried on and includes a motor vehicle if trade is carried on or in it;

“**Receiver of revenue**” has the same meaning as in the Vihiga County Revenue Administration ACT, 2015 and the Public Finance Management ACT, 2012;

“**Zone A**” means the areas not under Luanda Municipality, Kaimosi municipality and Vihiga Municipality;

“**Zone B**” means the area comprising of the faraway areas under the Luanda Municipality, Kaimosi municipality and Vihiga Municipality

“**Zone C**”. means the area comprising of the fairly prime areas under the Luanda Municipality, Kaimosi municipality and Vihiga Municipality and the Peri urban towns;

“**Zone D**” means the area comprising of the prime location areas under Luanda Municipality, Kaimosi municipality and Vihiga Municipality.

PART II— FEES AND TAXES PAYABLE AND RATES APPLICABLE

3. Proposed General Fees and Charges

- (1) A person who wishes to carry out the activities specified in the Second Column of the **First Schedule** shall pay the respective fees specified in the Fourth and Fifth Column of the same Schedule.
- (2) The County Executive Member shall, by notice in writing through the established channel of communication in operation in the county, prescribe the fees payable for single business permit.
- (3) Every person wishing to operate a single business within the County shall first apply for a permit to the County Government in the prescribed form on payment of the prescribed fee
- (4) There shall be paid, together with the prescribed fees, a cumulative monthly penalty of three percent for every late payment for single business permit.
- (5) A person who contravenes any provision in this section commits an offence.

4. Parking Fees and Penalties

- (1) A person who uses County parking space shall pay the fee specified in the **Second Schedule**.
- (2) A person who uses County parking space without paying the prescribed fees commits an offence.

- (3) Any vehicle found occupying a parking space without payment of the prescribed fees shall, subject to subsection (4), be liable to impoundment and detention.
- (4) A vehicle which is impounded or detained following impoundment or in which summons requiring court attendance have been served on the driver or the owner, shall only be released on payment of the penalties prescribed in the **Second Schedule**.

5. Solid Waste and Environmental Management

A person who wishes to receive or carry out the services specified in the Second Column of the **Third Schedule** at the unit measure specified in the Third Column of the same Schedule shall pay the fee specified in the Fourth Column of that Schedule.

6. Lands and Physical Planning Fees

- (1) A person who wishes to construct a building or structure on any land in the County shall apply for a construction permit to the department responsible for physical planning on payment of the fees prescribed in the Fourth Schedule accompanied by an approved plan for the building or structure.
- (2) A person who commences construction of a building or structure without the appropriate approved plan commits an offence and shall be liable in addition to the punishment prescribed in this Act, to pay the prescribed fees together the penalties specified in the Fourth Schedule.

7. Rental payments

- (1) A person occupying a plot, stall or building under lease or tenancy with the County Government shall pay in advance, rent at the rate specified in the last column of the respective Part of the **Fourth Schedule**.
- (2) The date for payment of rent under in sub-section (1) shall be-
 - (a) in the case of a plot, by the 1st day of January in each year; and
 - (b) in the case of a house, stall or other structure by the 10th day of every subsequent month.
- (3) A person who defaults to pay the rent within the timelines prescribed under this section shall be issued with a three months' notice of termination of lease or tenancy and be liable to eviction from the premises without other notice at the expiry of the sixth months if the amounts due have not been settled.
- (4) A penalty of three percent per month shall be charged on the outstanding rent on a plot that remains unpaid after the 31st day of March of the relevant year.
- (5) A penalty of ten percent per month shall be charged on the outstanding house rent which remains unpaid after the 11th day of every month.
- (6) The County may repossess any plot or rented premises referred to under this section if the person fails to pay rent for a period exceeding six months.
- (7) Any rent arrears accrued under this section may be recovered through civil proceedings in a court of law.

8. Hire of machinery

- 1. A person who wishes to hire for use a county machine shall first apply for a permit to the

relevant department of the County Government in the prescribed form on payment of the prescribed.

2. No permit shall be issued for hire of county machine for a period below four hours and every charge for use of county machine under this section shall be calculated on four-hour basis as the minimum.
3. Any person who approves the hire or hires county machine in violation of subsection (2) of this section commits an offence and liable to the penalties prescribed in this Act and if a public officer, shall be liable to disciplinary proceedings for recovery from him or her the loss arising from the violation in addition to any other punishment.

9. Operating quarry and transportation of quarry and other products

- (1) A person who operates a quarry or transports quarry products, red soil, or manure from or through the county shall upon application in the prescribed form, pay the fee prescribed in the Second Schedule.
- (2) A person transporting agricultural products from or through the County shall apply for authorization in the prescribed form on payment of the fee prescribed in the First Schedule.
- (3) A person who violates any provision of this section commits an offence and shall be liable to the penalty calculated at the market value of the load being transported.
- (4) For the purpose of this section, “**manure**” means; solid waste from livestock and compost.

10. Fees for use of County stadiums, grounds or halls.

- (1) A person who wishes to use the County stadia, grounds, hall or other facility shall apply for a permit in the prescribed form from the relevant department of the County Government on payment of the fee prescribed in the **Sixth Schedule**.
- (2) A person who uses or permits the use of County stadia, ground, hall or other facility in contravention of subsection (1) commits an offence and shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in this Act.

11. Food, drugs and health services permits

- (1) A person who wishes to sell any product, operate a business or receive any service related to or connected with food, drugs or health services shall first apply for a permit from the department responsible for health services in the County Government in the prescribed form on payment of the fee prescribed in the **Seventh Schedule**.
- (2) Where a department of the County government is to provide the services specified in the Seventh Schedule, the fee specified in that Schedule shall apply.

12. Public Medical Health Services

A person who receives medical or health services from the health facilities of the County Government specified in the Seventh Schedule shall pay the charges specified in the said Schedule or in another county legislation whichever is applicable.

13. Livestock and Veterinary Services Fees

A person who wishes to sell the products, operate the business or receive the services

specified in Part I of the Eighth Schedule relating to livestock and veterinary services including sale of food and drugs or receipt of county services related to or connected with livestock or veterinary services shall first apply for a permit from the department of the County Government responsible for livestock and veterinary services in the prescribed form on payment of the fee prescribed in the **Eighth Schedule**.

14. Outdoor Advertisement

(1) A person who wishes display advertisements and signages specified in the **Ninth Schedule** shall first apply for a permit from County Government in accordance with section 4 to section 20, all inclusive, of the County Outdoor Advertising Control Act Cap 276

(2) The fees prescribed in Part II, section 4(2)(a) shall apply to the Ninth Schedule of this Act.

15. Facilities under County Department of Education, Science, Technical and Vocational Training

(1) A person who wishes to register an Early Childhood Development and Education (ECDE) facility under the County Department of Education, Science, Technical and Vocational Training in the **Tenth Schedule** shall first apply to the department in the prescribed form and on payment of the fees prescribed in that Schedule.

(2) A person who operates or manages an ECDE facility in violation of sub-section (1) of this section commits an offence and shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in this Act.

16. Alcoholic drinks control licensing and regulation under County Department of Public Service Administration and ICT

(1) The fees and charges provided in the Eleventh Schedule shall apply to alcoholic drinks control licensing and regulation under the Vihiga County Alcoholic Drinks Control Act and the regulations made thereunder shall apply in all cases of alcoholic drinks control and licensing.

(2) In the case of any inconsistency between the charges and fees prescribed in the provisions of the county legislation specified under sub-section(1) and this Act, the provisions of this Act shall prevail to the extent of the inconsistency.

17. Tax Waivers Variations

(1) The Executive Committee Member responsible for finance may in writing, exempt, waive or vary fees or charges payable under this Act in accordance to the criteria prescribed in a notice published in the Gazette.

(2) An application for a tax exemption, waiver or variation shall be in writing and shall be submitted to the County Executive Committee member.

(3) Despite any provision of this section, persons living with disabilities in possession of a valid certificate of tax exemption shall be entitled to a waiver of forty percent of the respective taxes, fees and charges as provided in this Act.

18. Impoundment yards

The designated areas and offices within the sub-county revenue premises in every Sub-County, within Vihiga Municipal grounds and at the County Government headquarters in Mbale Town shall serve as yards for storage of impounded goods.

PART III—PAYMENT

19. Payments to the County

- (1) All payments due to the County shall be paid through authorized channels notified by the revenue collector or enforcement officer.
- (2) A County Revenue Collector or Enforcement Officer enforcing this Act shall have an Identification badge issued by the County Government of Vihiga.
- (3) The identification badge issued under sub-section (2) shall be worn visibly by the officer when carrying out any of the functions under this Act.
- (4) An official receipt shall be issued for every payment made to the County Government under this Act.
- (5) A payment made to the County Government under this Act shall be evidenced by official receipt.
- (7) A person shall not receive or collect any money due to or on behalf of the County Government as revenue under this Act or other county legislation unless that person has been authorized to do so under this Act.
- (8) Any County revenue collector or enforcement officer who violates any provision of this section shall be guilty of gross misconduct and liable to disciplinary proceedings leading to dismissal

20. Appointment and assignment of duties to agents

Appointment and assignment of duties agents shall be in accordance with the legislation governing revenue administration in the County

21. Seizure (impounding) of Goods

- (1) A County revenue collector may seize or impound goods if he has reasonable grounds to believe that revenue in respect of the goods has not been paid.
- (2) Goods seized or impounded under sub-section (1) shall be recorded in a register maintained for the purpose and stored in the designated arrears designated in section 18 and in the manner to ensure the safety and security of the goods.
- (3) When the goods referred to in sub-section (1), have been seized or impounded, the revenue collector shall, having regard to the conditions of the goods, serve the owner of the goods or the person who had the custody or control of the goods, a notice in writing-
 - (a) identifying the goods;
 - (b) stating that the goods have been seized under this section and the reasons for seizure;
 - (c) setting out the terms for the release or disposal of the goods; and
 - (d) stating that the goods shall be forfeited to the County, if not claimed in accordance with subsection
- (1) The County Receiver of Revenue or Authorized Revenue Collector shall authorize the goods to be released, to whom the notice was served under subsection (3), upon payment of

revenue due and payable together with any penalties and cost that may have accrued from the seizure or impoundment of the goods.

(2) If subsection (4) does not apply, the Authorized Revenue Collector in consultation with the County Receiver of Revenue or the revenue collector shall detain the goods seized or impounded under sub-section (1)-

- a) in case of perishable goods, for a period that is reasonable but not exceeding forty-eight hours, having regards to the conditions of the goods; or
- b) in any other case, for thirty days following the seizure.

(3) When the retention period under sub-section (5) has expired, the goods shall be treated as having been forfeited to the County Receiver of Revenue and shall be disposed of by public auction or private treaty in accordance with the provisions of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act, 2015 or county policy on disposal of assets and the proceeds therefrom paid into the County Revenue Account.

(4) The County Government shall not bear any cost, loss, loss of user or damage resulting from the impounded items, goods or other property unless caused by willful or negligent act or omission of its officer or officers the burden of proof whereof shall lie on the claimant

PART IV—OFFENCES AND PENALTIES UNDER THE BILL

22. General offences and penalties

Subject to section 22 Any person who violates any provision of this Act, commits an offence, and shall be liable on conviction, where no other penalty is provided, to a fine not exceeding twenty thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or both.

23. Offences by Staff of the County Government

- (1)** A member of staff of the County, agent or any other person having a duty to perform under this Act who-
 - (a) makes, in any record, or document required to be kept or made by that person, an entry which he or she knows or has reasonable cause to believe not to be true or to be false;
 - (b) willfully refuses to do anything which he or she knows or has reasonable cause to know is required to be done;
 - (c) interferes with any other person or process under this Act, so as to defeat the provisions, requirements or purposes of this Act;
 - (d) where required under this Act to do anything to give effect to the provisions of this Act, fails to do such thing;
 - (e) without reasonable cause avoids to do something in breach of his or her duty under this Act;
 - (f) willfully contravenes the provisions of this Act to give undue advantage or favor to another person; or
 - (g) fails to prevent or report to the County Government or any other relevant authority, an

offence committed under this Act, Commits an offence.

(2) A person who is found guilty of an offence under sub-section (1) of this section shall be liable on conviction, to a fine not exceeding two hundred thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year, or both.

PART V— MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

24. Savings

- (1) Any charges, permit fees, licenses fees, rent, infrastructure maintenance fee and such other fees payable to the County Government at the commencement of this Act but which are not included in any of the Schedules to this Act, shall continue to apply as though the same were provided in this Act.
- (2) All orders, directions, resolutions, orders and authorizations on, or relating to financial management, including the collection and administration of fees and charges given or issued by the previous county councils, municipal councils, town councils or urban councils, before the commencement of this Act shall be deemed to have been given, issued or made by or under this Act, until the revocation, expiry or repeal of those notices directions, resolutions, orders and authorizations, and shall continue, with the necessary modifications, to apply, be paid and administered under this Act;

Provided that this sub-section shall also apply to such fees and charges levied by various ministries and departments of the National Government within the County in respect of functions devolved to the County under Part 2 of the Fourth Schedule of the Constitution which fees and charges shall be levied by the County on performance of the devolved functions

- (3) All references to councils shall include be reference to all Local Authorities in existence under the repealed Local Government Act, Cap. 265 Laws of Kenya.

25. Cessation

Unless otherwise provided in this Act, the rates for fees, charges, licenses, cess or rent applicable to the goods, services or activities listed in the Schedules which applied before the commencement on this shall cease to apply on commencement of this Act but without prejudice to the right of the County Government to recover any unpaid or outstanding arrears owe by a person on the date of commencement

26. Advance Payments

- (1) Notwithstanding the units of measure of time provided in the Schedules to this Act, the Executive Committee Member responsible for finance may develop and publish guidelines for receipt of advance payments for a period of three, six and twelve months.
- (2) Where a person elects to pay in advance as provided in sub-section (a), the County Government shall issue a special card showing the details of the payment and expiry of the term for the payment.
- (3) The Executive Committee Member responsible for finance may with approval of the County Executive Committee provide for discounts under this section to encourage advance and timely payments.

- (4) A person who contravenes the guidelines issued under subsection (1) of this section commits an offence and shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in sections 23 or 24 whichever shall be applicable.

27. Amendment of the Schedules.

- (1) Subject to sub-section (2), the Executive Committee Member responsible for finance may with the approval of the County Executive Committee and the County Assembly and by an order published in the Gazette amend any of the Schedules
- (2) An order under sub-section (1) shall be laid before the County Assembly for approval without unreasonable delay, and unless a resolution approving the order is passed by the County Assembly within twenty-one days from the date it was laid or next when the Assembly sits after the order is so laid, the order shall lapse, but without prejudice to anything previously done under the order.

28. Amendment of the Vihiga County Trade Licence Act 2017

- (1) The Vihiga County Trade License Act 2017 is amended as specified in the **Twelfth Schedule**.
- (2) The provisions of the Vihiga County Trade License Act 2017 specified in the First column of the **Twelfth Schedule** are amended as specified in the Second column of the Schedule.

29. Regulations

The Executive Committee Member may make regulations for the better carrying out of the purposes and provisions of this Act.

Statements of Objects and Reasons for the Bill

The Constitution mandates County Governments to levy charges for services provided and to generally fund the activities provided under the Fourth Schedule of the Constitution. The said revenue is meant to supplement the allocation from the National Government to the County with a view to financing the County budget.

The Finance Bill is mandatory for the completion of the legal instruments in the budgetary process. The Bill formulates the proposals announced in the Budget relating to collection of revenue and other taxes for matters incidental thereto.

It raises various categories of levies and charges that shall be applied to various services in the County in line with the market rates.
